1. Make the Commitment

Agree to free up two hours once a month, October-January, to meet with your group.

2. Find a Group

The ideal size for a group is 6-10 people. Groups can be made up of all men, all women, couples, or even a mixture of all of the above. We are encouraging you to find your own group. If you choose the people you want to be with, you are more likely to stay committed to your group. But don't just stick to your

friends, invite someone you want to get to know better, too! If you don't know who to start a group with, Danielle Jones will help!

4. Plan to attend GO NIGHT.

Go Night is when you will meet your group, select your study, plan the dates your group is going to meet, and get started!

Choose from these studies:

- **1. Questions of Jesus.** Have you ever noticed that Jesus asks a lot of questions? Dig into three questions Jesus asks in the gospels and discover what they mean for you.
- **2.** How to Win at Life. Do you wish there was a handbook for how to best live life? This study focuses on the book of James who worked to write a handbook for how to follow God.
- **3. Sermon Reflections.** Each lesson in this series will focus on the sermon series we are preaching on Sunday mornings.


FAMILIES MOVING FORWARD Sunday, 10/21-Saturday, 10/28

and overnight hosting. WCC will host families from Sunday, October 21 through Saturday, October 28.


