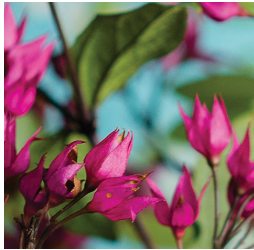

Christian, Jewish and Muslim perspectives. Presentations will be followed by small group discussions. Refreshments will be provided.

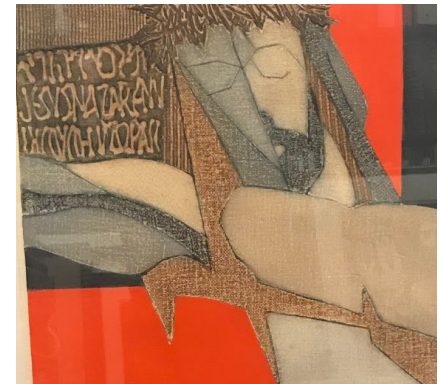


INTRODUCTION TO ESTATE PLANNING AND PLANNED GIVING
