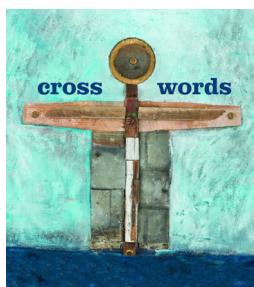

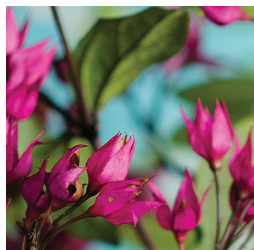


LENTEN SERMON SERIES

will explore this topic from Christian, Jewish, and Muslim perspectives. Presentations will be followed by small group discussions. Refreshments provided.

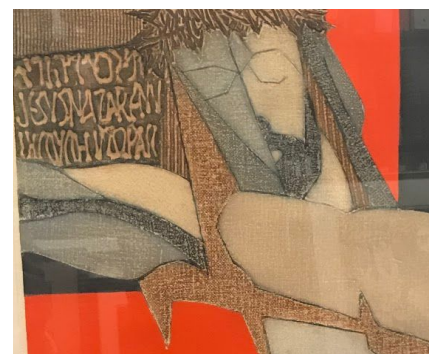


INTRODUCTION TO ESTATE PLANNING AND PLANNED GIVING

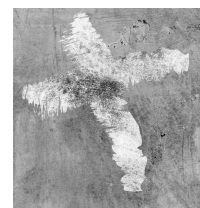

Sacred Enneagram Workshop

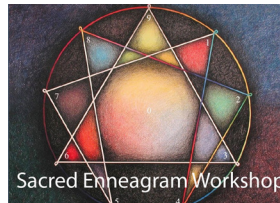

Lenten Study Groups

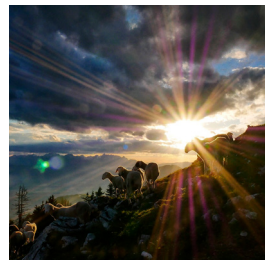
