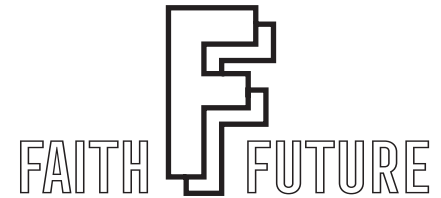


### Celebrating Gabe & Hilary!

## Families Moving Forward

## Volunteers: E2 English Skype Program

Volunteers are needed to participate in 30 minute skype video calls from their home computer, tablet or phone to help students at Emprededora High School in Nicaragua practice English. Volunteers receive the weekly topic along with sample questions and conversation ideas in advance. During the skype call, pairs of students begin by presenting what they have prepared. When they have finished, volunteers can ask questions and have a conversation with the students about the topic. Volunteers do NOT need to know any Spanish. Practice sessions with skype are available if you are unfamiliar with video calling. Sign up now for our 2nd session which will run from May 22-August 8, with no calls the week of July 4th (11 weeks.) Calls will continue to be during the day on Wednesdays and Thursdays during Emprededora's English classes.
