**Synopsis:** In a world where toys come to life when no human is watching, a good-hearted cowboy doll named Woody sees his position as his owner Andy's favorite toy jeopardized when Andy gets a Buzz Lightyear action figure for his birthday. Woody, consumed with jealousy and insecurity, tries to get rid of Buzz and in the process they become lost together in the world beyond Andy's room. They must find a way back to Andy before he and his family move without them, but they will have to set their differences aside and work together to get passed the ruthless toy-killer next door, Sid Phillips.
