Did You Know..... Just 25% of Minnesotans who qualify for low income rental assistance actually receive that assistance. Waiting lists stretch for years. At the same time, 100% of all homeowners with a mortgage receive a tax deduction on their mortgage interest. Both policies are housing subsidies, but one policy excludes many of those with the most need. Our nation, and our state, have the resources to help those most in need as well as to provide sound economic policy, and our faith call us to do both.
