- MESSAGE: this is the "why" of Summer Camp. We will share an honest and compelling picture of God's love as we experience it through Jesus Christ.
   The Gospel should be the best news we ever hear — that we are loved and called to love others while we serve others, too.
- AFFIRMATION: we love every student, just as they are. Period. There are very
  few places in the world where kids can be themselves without anyone
  asking them to perform (academically, athletically, musically, etc.).
   Campers will know that they are free to be themselves and that they are
  whole-heartedly loved with no strings attached.
- COMMUNITY: one outcome of accomplishing the first four goals is a profound experience of Community. Camp relationships far often live on long past the camp experience.

We have another incredible summer planned for 2024. We will be back at the Chi Rho Center and we will be ready for all God will do through Camp this summer.

### **Check-in & Return Procedures**

All Camp sessions check in at 12:00 noon on the first day of your camp session. Check-in takes place in the Gym and West entrance at Wayzata Community Church, 125 Wayzata Blvd. East. A map to the church will be provided in your camp packet. All campers will be returned to the church at 12:30 p.m. on the final day of the session. (The bus may be 10-15 minutes delayed, based on traffic.) Cabin assignments will be communicated at check-in.

# **Transportation**

Campers are transported to and from Chi Rho Center on school buses, operated by professional drivers. Please make sure that your camper's luggage makes it into the luggage trailer. Chaperones will be on each bus to ensure a positive experience on the way to and from camp.

# Late arrivals/early departures

We strongly discourage partial camp experiences due to late arrivals and/or early departures. The experience of camp is designed with the expectation that all campers will be there for the entire camp session; any changes in the makeup of the camper population affects not only the absent person but all of those in camp. Any late arrivals or early departures must be approved by the Camp Director, at least 7 days prior to the camper's session.

# Food & Lodging

All meals take place in the dining hall, with meals prepared by the kitchen staff, and served by the Work Crew. Please notify us of any dietary restrictions your child has.

# **Camp Store**

Campers have opportunities each day to buy snacks and specialty items at the camp store. Clothing items and gifts, such as hats, t-shirts and sweatshirts range in price from \$5 to \$50. You will have the opportunity at check-in to put cash on to a "debit card", which will be kept at the Camp Store (preferred). Campers may also purchase items or snacks with cash. Parents should use their own discretion in the amount of extra money sent with their camper. Refunds will not be offered from the camp store.

### **Registration Process**

Beginning Thursday, January 25th, 2024 at 10:00 a.m., register online for Summer Camp 2024 at www.wayzatacommunitychurch.org/summer-camp-registration. If you have not created an account in Campsite already, you will begin by creating an account for your family, including all your 2024 campers. Have your campers' current health immunization and insurance card handy when you go online, as this information will be required during the registration process. A non-refundable deposit of \$100 is required for each registered camper.

NOTE: We highly recommend that you create your family account in Campsite ahead of time, as this will make the registration process on January 25th more efficient.

#### **Cabinmates**

We recognize that a sense of security begins at the time of registration when kids can request other students to be their cabin mates. We offer a chance to request three cabin mates, and will go to great effort to accommodate at least **one** of these requests. However circumstances do arise that make it impossible to grant every request. Please be aware that groups are often divided between different cabins. All requests must be made 14 days prior to camp.

#### After registration is completed

- 1. Following the completion of enrollment in Campsite, including the \$100 deposit, you will receive an email confirming that your child is registered.
- 2. Changes made after your child has been registered for a camp session will be based on space and availability and require approval by the camp registrars. You may not change the registration of any child but your own. To request a change, send an email to Kathy at khandy@ wayzatacommunitychurch.org.

# **Payment & Refund Policy**

Payments are all made through your account in Campsite. A \$100 non-refundable deposit is due at Registration for all Campers. There are three ways to pay for camp:

- · Pay in Full at registration, or
- One installment plan (pay \$100 non-refundable depost, balance due on May 1st)
- Two installments plan (pay \$100 non-refundable depost, 50% due on March 15th, balance due on May 1st)

Credit cards on record will be billed automatically for Installment Plans. No refunds on any camp payments will be given after May 1, 2024.

### **Additional Staff**

#### Counselors & Summer Staff

Our staff of college-age young adults (and graduates) includes many of the faces that your children have seen and gotten to know through camp over the past summers. These young adults have many natural gifts, and will develop these through an intensive 6 day staff training, as well as daily meetings and guidance from the Camp Leadership Team. Through our careful selection process we recruit and train our staff in the important work of building

relationships with kids. It is the heart of all that we do at camp.

Our counselor to camper ratio is one counselor to every four campers.

#### Medical & Safety Team

We will have a nurse or doctor on the camp premises 24 hours of each day that camp is in session. Our medical team will be thoroughly supported to meet the medical and physical needs of each camper, including the treatment of illness or injury, administration of medicines from home, handling of any allergies, and coordination of any communication to parents, if necessary. Certified waterfront staff operate the swimming and boating area at all times. All of our waterfront staff are trained in Red Cross Water Safety to assure the best care and attention near the water.



# High School Work Crew

We hope that incoming 10th-12th grade students consider serving through our Work Crew Ministry. Work Crew is an opportunity for students to experience an extended service-based faith experience. Each session consists of a small group of students who are devoted to serving God, the camp, and the campers. By doing much of the behind-the-scenes work that enables camp to run so smoothly, the participants learn how to give of themselves without seeking credit or praise. The program for the children's sessions helps to ensure a positive first overnight experience at camp, including age-appropriate matters of faith. Children attending these camps can expect play time at the lake, outdoor games and activities, creative expression in the Craft Cabin, hikes in the woods, campfire music and singing, hilarious skits, and mealtime characters. Of course, we're holding back a few surprises! Activities end at 9:30 p.m. for this age group, with wake-up at 7:30 a.m.

# Middle School Camp

For campers entering 7th-9th Grades, 6 days and 5 nights

Session Fee: \$630.00

The program for middle school campers is focused on fun and friendship. It is an ideal introduction into Middle School and a time for deepening relationships with peers and counselors through group games and events, tubing on the lake, wakeboarding, music, character skits, crafts, and time in nature. Middle School campers are invited into increasingly mature discussions of faith and spirituality with their peers and counselors.

Session Fee: \$630.00
