TRANSPORTATION

Campers are transported to and from Chi Rho Center by buses, operated by professional drivers. Camper luggage will be checked at curbside and loaded onto buses at Check-In. Chaperones will be on each bus to maintain a positive experience on the way to and from camp. To preserve the fullest camp experience, late arrivals and/or early departures are discouraged, but can be accommodated in certain circumstances.

The experience of camp is designed with the expectation that all campers will be there for the entire camp session; any changes in the makeup of the camper population affects not only the absent person but all of those in camp.

Any late arrivals or early departures must be approved by the Camp Director, at least 7 days prior to the camper's session. **There will be an adult chaperone on each bus to camp.

Return Procedure

All campers will be returned to WCC at 12:00 p.m (noon) on the final day of the session. The bus may be 10-15 minutes delayed, based on traffic. See the Bus Schedule below.

CHECK-IN

*Note for packing: Camp is a tobacco-free, vape free, drug-free, alcohol-free and weap-on-free environment. Tobacco, vapes, illegal drugs, alcohol, and weapons are strictly prohibited. Any deviation from this policy will be cause for immediate removal from camp.

Children must be supervised at Check-In by a parent/guardian until they board the bus.

Upon arrival please make your way to the following stations:

1. General Check-in Station

- Confirm name & receive cabin assignment
- Pick-up camper t-shirt and lanyard.

2. Curbside Bag Check

 Your camper's bag will be tagged according to cabin assignment and loaded onto the bus. Make sure you remove all medications fom camper luggage so that they can be logged by the Camp Nurse.

3. Camp Nurse Check-In Station

• Our head Medical Professional, Mary Jane Hochstein, will confirm your camper's medications, insurance, and other health related items.

4. Camp Store Station

 We are not accepting cash for items this year. Please deposit money into your camper's account before sneding them to camp. No refunds will be given.

5. Optional Station for writing personalized notes for your campers.

We know campers love to hear from their family while at camp. We will have
a letter writing station at Check-In. Feel free to write as many letters as
you would like. There is a new "no care packages" policy this year.

Return Procedure

All campers will be returned to WCC at 12:00 p.m (noon) on the final day of the session. The bus may be 10-15 minutes delayed, based on traffic. (See Bus Schedule on page 3.)

Camp 2024 Theme: SUMMER OLYMPICS TRAINING FACILITY

We are excited to announce that YOUR CAMPERS have qualified for the 2024 Summer Olympics, and they are invited to WCC Summer Camp at Chi Rho to train for their upcoming Olympic debut! The Olympics celebrate the incredible gifts and backgrounds of people globally; in a similar way, God uniquely gifts each of us with skills, strengths, and passions. Although there are medalists in every Olympic event, the underlying point of the Olympics is not to just collect hardware but also to inspire unity. This summer, we will be celebrating both what makes us unique and what makes us a community, much like how Paul describes the body of Christ in 1 Corinthians 12.

Theme costumes can be based on Olympic symbolism, a sport, a particular athlete, or maybe you could even create your own Olympic event to represent in costume. Take as much creative license as you want; we cannot wait to see what you come up with!

Staff

Our staff is made up of incredible young adults who pour their heart and soul into ensuring your camper has the best week of their summer. Our staff is trained extensively and include members who are lifeguard and CPR certified.

Payment Schedule for Summer Camp

Families will have the following options for camper payment installments:

- Pay in full on or before May 15, 2024.
- Two payment plan (Equal payments on March 15th & May 15th)
- Three payment plan (Equal payments on March 15th, April 15th, & May 15th)
- All credit cards set on installments will be charged automatically.

Camp Store

Campers have opportunities each day to buy specialty items at the camp store. Clothing items and gifts, such as hats, t-shirts and sweatshirts range in price from \$5 to \$50. You will have the opportunity at check-in to put cash on to a "debit card", which will be kept at the Camp Store (preferred). Parents should use their own discretion in the amount of extra money sent with their camper. **No refunds will be given on camp store deposits.**

Cell Phones

To keep camp as "sacred space," it is important that cell phones are kept at home. This policy insures the experience of each individual camper, as well as the group community that is formed. Thank you for supporting us in this effort!

Please remember that phones are available and used by the Camp Director, in cases of emergency or necessary contact from parents at home. If campers mistakenly bring phones they will be kept by the Camp Director until the session has ended.

Meals

Three meals and an evening snack are provided daily by the Chi Rho Center staff. In addition, campers are able to purchase snacks at the camp store each afternoon.

CAMP IS NUT FREE

We are able to accomodate most dietary restrictions. Please make sure your campers needs are well documented on their Campsite profile, or feel free to send an email to Camp.

*** Due to food allergies in camp, please do not send any additional snacks or food with your camper. ***

Homesickness

Homesickness can be a normal part of going to camp, particularly for the first-time camper. You may wish to tell your child that they may miss home, but they will also have many new and amazing experiences and may even end up wishing camp were longer.

Please do not make promises that your child can call or come home. It has been our strong experience that this is not helpful for campers. We will be in contact if the situation requires that. Rest assured your camper will be cared for in a supportive, nurturing manner. Camp staff are prepared for helping children adjust to camp while minimizing homesickness.

Within any group of peers there is the possibility for social challenges. Our camp staff will be intentional in discouraging hurtful or exclusionary behavior, and to helping to mediate any conflicts that exist or arise. Our daily activities are based on the principles of safety, inclusivity, and fun; never at the expense of anyone's feelings, sense of value or well-being. Any bullying or mistreatment of a camper is unacceptable and will be confronted by the camp staff and the Camp Director.

Prohibited Items

Camp is a tobacco-free, vape free, drug-free, alcohol-free and weapon-free environment. Tobacco, vapes, illegal drugs, alcohol, and weapons are strictly prohibited. Any deviation from this policy will be cause for immediate removal from camp.
