
#### **The Sunday After Christmas**




#### Thursday, June 25, 2026 • 7:30 p.m.

## What Do You Fear? Insisting on Hope this Advent

Wednesdays, December 3, 10, 17 4:00 & 6:30 p.m. in the Colonnade Led by Rev. Dan Stark

This Advent, join us for a three-week series that explores the anxieties of the season and helps us uncover gritty, resilient hope. Luke's Gospel begins in a fearful world—one marked by oppression and uncertainty, not unlike our own. Yet even in the chaos, angels whisper a timeless message: "Do not fear." Grounded in the Sanctified Art theme, this class invites us to:

- Acknowledge our fears without letting them freeze us.
- Learn from Mary, Joseph, and the shepherds who moved through fear to say, "Here I am, Lord."
- Discover how naming our fears opens our eyes to where God is breaking in with good news of great joy.

Fear can divide and paralyze—but what if we could transform it into love and action? Let's insist on hope together, remembering that even hope that trembles is still hope.




