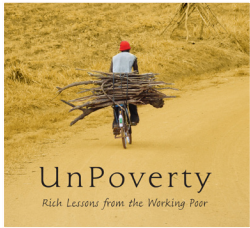

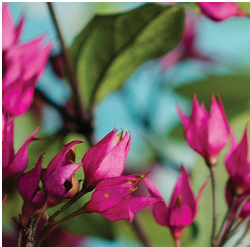
CORE: Planning a Celebration of Life

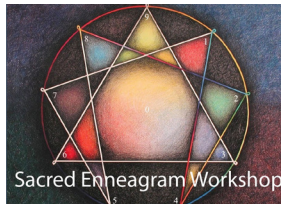

Have you ever asked yourself the quintessential human question of identity, "What am I?" Most of us spend a lifetime trying to figure out who we are and how we relate to other and God. Unfortunately, in the process of forming an identity, we succumb to building up lies and illusions around our sense of self that only lead us further away from who we truly are.

But the Enneagram offers a bright path to cutting through the internal clutter and finding our way back to who we are created to be. Based on the nine classic archetypes of human character structure, the Enneagram exposes the nine ways we lie to ourselves about who we think we are, illustrates the nine ways we get lost, and reveals nine ways we find our way home to our True Self and to God. 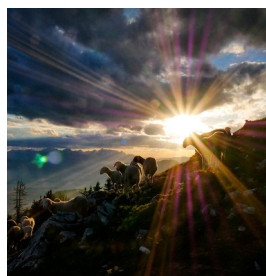
