Our contemporary worship style includes a variety of music, Celebration Singers choir, an inspiring message and milestone celebrations of our faith life together. *

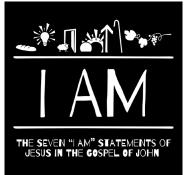

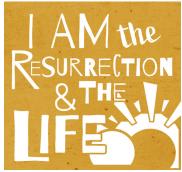
Parables is uniquely crafted for people with special needs and their families. Services are designed to welcome everyone just as they are with music, an inspiring message, and connections in community. *

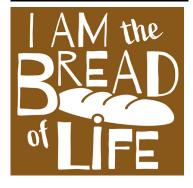

I AM: THE STATEMENTS OF JESUS

Sundays, March 6 - April 10 Rev. Danielle Jones, Rev. Dan Stark & Rev. Lindy Purdy preaching

Who do you say Jesus is? Wise Sage. Moral example. Profound Teacher. These are a few ways that Jesus has been characterized throughout history. While our articulations may have nuggets of truth, how Jesus portrays himself is far more important for our understanding of who Jesus truly was and what kind of difference that makes in our lives. These profound statements will guide us through our Lenten journey each week as we seek God together.

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. Lent is a 40 day season of fasting (not including Sundays) that is an imitation of Jesus' time in the wilderness before he began his public ministry. Lent invites us into a prolonged time of self-reflection, fasting, service, and giving that prepares us for Easter.

The journey begins on Ash Wednesday when we remind one another that we are dust and that one day we will return to the dust. We will worship together with music, reflection, confession, and the imposition of ashes. All are welcome to these services to begin your Lenten journey in community.

HOLY WEDNESDAY

FIRST CENTURY COMMUNITY MEAL April 13, 5:15 p.m. in Mithun Hall

MAUNDY THURSDAY, TENEBRAE WITH COMMUNION

The service of Tenebrae, meaning "darkness" or "shadows", has been practiced by the church for hundreds of years. Tenebrae is a prolonged mediation on Christ's journey to the cross.

Music and Scripture Readings trace the story of Christ's final days on earth. As lights are extinguished, we remember Christ's deep and abiding love for us even as we also remember his suffering and death.

Hello! It's hard to believe that we are in the Lenten Season already. March 2nd is Ash Wednesday which marks the beginning of the 40 day walk toward Easter. This is the perfect time to look closely at our daily actions and behaviors to see if we are living out the ways of Jesus in the world.

A good way to do this is to look at the fruits of the spirit which Paul wrote about in the New Testament. The 9 Fruits are: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, generosity and self control. Which of these fruits are easiest for you? Which are the hardest? Ask everyone in your family to focus on one of the fruits to work on over the 40 days. Check in with each other at bedtime to see how you did that day. Pray about it. Talk about it. Read Bible passages together. At the end of the 40 days when Easter is finally here, check in as a family to see how you all did!

At WCC we are preparing many ways for the whole family to find meaning during the Lenten season. Join us on Ash Wednesday as we focus on others in our community in our annual Mission fair— Mission in Motion. This is the perfect way to set the tone for the 40 days of Lent ahead. In addition, each week on Wednesdays and Sundays you and your kids can experience Christ through meaningful classes and activities. Just look ahead to find out more! Hope to see you in church!

A program of protest and perseverance, with music evoking the free nature of birds. Opening the program with a spirit of transience, the sweeping melodies of Robert Schumann's *Fantasiestuck for Cello and Piano* offer expressive leaps between moods characteristic of the Romantic era. Premiered last season during the pandemic, Brent Michael Davids' *Taptonahana for Solo Flute* is a musical exploration of language and the generative process of song-ing. 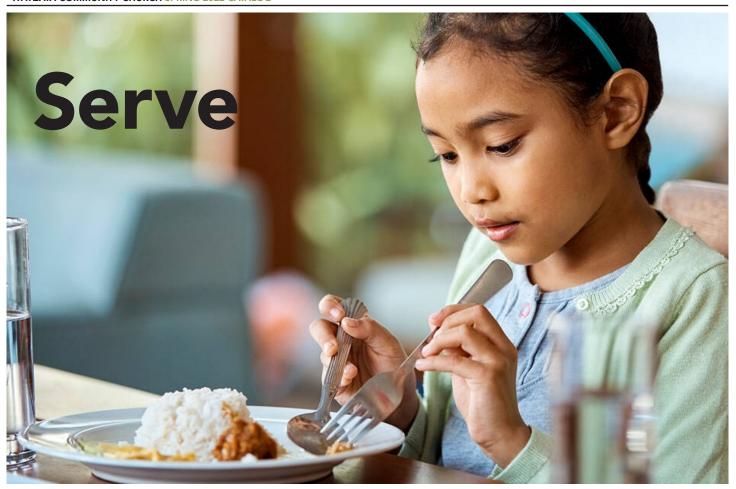
