


10:30 a.m. Traditional Worship: Join us for organ and hymn-based worship that has a liturgical feel and includes an inspiring message each week. *




SERMON SERIES

ADULT FAITH FORMATION

THE CONTEMPLATIVE PRACTICES PROGRAM IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF ST. CATHERINE

Spiritual Formation is the subject of many conversations that Danielle and I have had over the past twelve months. When discussing ministries, classes, and worship services, we consistently ask, how does doing that help people become spiritually formed as followers of Jesus? And while group spiritual formation is an essential goal of all our ministries, we've recognized a need to prioritize a process for individual spiritual formation as well.

Wayzata Community Church received a unique opportunity for spiritual formation this summer. We are one of eight Metro churches participating in The Contemplative Practices Program, funded by a generous grant by the Lilly Foundation, in partnership with the University of St. Catherine. Our participation in this program will lead us to be able to build our own unique program of contemplation and spiritual formation.

With the support of this grant, the WCC Contemplative Practices Program cohort of members and leaders will dive deeply into their spirituality, exploring nine spiritual practices during September 2023 through May 2024. Having first gone inward grounded in God's love and mercy, the group will then explore how to go outward, learning contemplative practices that can be used in the community during the 2024-25 WCC program year. There also will be opportunities for the group to share the program with the congregation, as well as to meet with the other participating churches during each program year. Our participation in this program will be covered fully by the Lilly Foundation.

We welcome your prayers and support for the future of our growth as a congregation in contemplation and spiritual formation.

- You desire to ask important questions about life and faith
- You are free most Tuesdays throughout the year.

This group will meet three Tuesdays a month. We will take a three week break in December and we will have one retreat at an agreed upon time with the group (two days, including an overnight). You can miss the group here and there but the more you are present the more you will get out of it! The cost is \$120 for materials (two big journeybooks). Scholarships are available. season of doubt and questioning, it can be confusing and disorienting. The good news is that this isn't a bad thing, it's actually healthy! Questioning what you believe is not a sign that you're losing your faith, it's a sign that you're *growing* in your faith. This four week class, facilitated by Steve Wiens, will offer space to discuss how we can move through these seasons with patience and honesty.

Expanding the Enneagram with Stephanie Spencer *

The Enneagram is a helpful tool not only for self discovery but also for

empathy in relationships. But many of us have only experienced Enneagram content through the head, in an information-based approach. This approach is instructional, but also limited. If we aren't careful, reading too many Enneagram Type descriptions can become more like boxes of limitation than pathways of growth.

In this class, Stephanie Spencer will help you get out of those boxes. Using content from her book, Out of the Box and Into the Wild: An Enneagram Journey Through the Triads of Nature, as a launching point, she will lead the group through both learning and interactive practices, helping us see why we are unique, what we have in common, and how we can find more compassion and effectiveness in our interactions with one another. Registration fee of \$25 includes a copy of Stephanie's book which will be available at the first class.


THURSDAY FAITH BIBLE STUDY

I live a quarter mile from Methodist Hospital, an ever-present reminder that what John Wesley called the "social mission" of Christians has been featured prominently in the **history of the church.** The history of the church has seen churches build hospitals, banks and vibrant universities all in response to the needs of the community. Sunday School began as a social mission. When church members realized that kids didn't know how to read, they set out to do something about it, using the Bible as the textbook in their reading school that met after worship on Sundays, now known as "Sunday School".

In 2020, Wayzata Community Church reached back into that vital Christian tradition of responding to the needs of the community by launching a brand new mission initiative called "Dough" to help people and ideas rise.

The Dough process gave WCC the opportunity to help people start new initiatives that impact a variety of community needs in the Twin Cities including hunger, homelessness, job creation, financial inclusion, and more. Social entrepreneurs will be invited to apply for start-up investment grants from the church. Applicants will not only receive consideration for funding, they will receive training, technical assistance, and encouragement from church members like you who have great skills and ideas to share in helping mission and good ideas rise.

Helping People and Ideas Rise

The purpose of the Dough initiative at WCC, is to use the giftedness of the congregation and financial resources from the Board of Mission and Outreach, as yeast for new social ventures that will bring measurable good far outside our church walls.

Dough will help social entrepreneurs rise by connecting good ideas with

skills, experience, and resources in our congregation and our community, that will help their social ventures succeed.

Dough will help our community rise by investing in sustainable and innovative ideas that are sharpened via coaching from our congregation, accelerating the successful launch of creative and faithful ideas that address major challenges in our city and world.

Dough will also help our congregation rise by exciting and involving the Monday through Friday vocational giftedness of WCC members and connecting those vocational gifts to our faith as we together serve the world. WCC members will serve as coaches, incubators, innovators, accelerators and partners in God's creative work in the world, using all the gifts we have been blessed with to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God.

But why dough?

Last year, the Board of Mission and Outreach refined their focus by exploring new options to infuse the grant process with new focus and intention. It was the goal of the Board to both be wise stewards of the funds at WCC and to get as many members as possible to engage in mission. We believe engaging in the process of Dough will help us use our funds to activate mission that will do good in the world while inspiring our members to serve using their time and talents. Dough unleashes those resources for the sake of Christ's work in the world, engaging all of us in the vital Christian tradition of social mission.

We've long been challenged to heed a personal and collective calling to do justice, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with our Lord and now we have a plan to put our calling into action. The dough is ready, it's time to add you— the yeast.
