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
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Vivaldi's Gloria

Our contemporary worship style includes a variety of music, Celebration Singers choir, an inspiring message and milestone celebrations of our faith life together. *





LENT & EASTER SERIES WANDERING HEART: FIGURING OUT FAITH WITH PETER

During this Lenten sermon series, we'll affirm that faith is a constant journey of steadfast pursuit, one that ebbs and flows, seeks and wanders. Using the hymn "Come Thou

Fount" as a guide, we'll affirm that wandering is exploration, not necessarily distance from God. We'll explore all the ways Peter wanders but keeps going: he drops his nets, he walks on water, he runs to the empty tomb, he swims to the shore to meet the risen Christ. He keeps searching and yearning and loving, even after missteps or mistakes. Ultimately, in Peter's story, we are reminded that God loves imperfect people. This Lent, we'll look for ourselves in the stepping stones of Peter's story. We'll reflect on the stages of our own faith journeys as well as who and what has shaped us along the way.

Good Friday, March 29 At 12 Noon in the Sanctuary


Join us at noon on Good Friday for a reflective service featuring Contemporary music, Scripture readings, and a brief meditation as we walk with Jesus all the way to the cross.

Winter Speaker Series: To Love is To Listen

January 24, 31 and February 7, 2024 • 6:30 p.m in the Chapel (no 4 p.m. offering)

In John's gospel, Jesus tells his followers to "love one another as I have loved you." But how do we love one another in a culture that promotes division, fear and mistrust? By listening to each other's stories. It's not necessary to agree or to believe the same things in order to love one another. During this series, we'll hear hopeful stories that expand our perspectives and draw us together instead of apart.



JANUARY 24: Understanding the Israeli/Palestinian Conflict with Mike Bussey

Mike Bussey spent nine years as the CEO of the Jerusalem International YMCA, which was nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize for its historic work in building peaceful coexistence in the Middle East. Mike has served

on the NAYDO Council (North American YMCA Development Organization), as the National YMCA Director for World Camp '88 and as the YMCA of the USA's representative to YMCAs in the Middle East. He now lives in Woodbury so he and his wife Marcia can be close to their seven amazing grandchildren. Mike will share stories of Israelis and Palestinians who are working for peace in the Middle East.



JANUARY 31: Healing Minnesota Stories with Jim Bear Jacobs

Born in St. Paul, Jim Bear Jacobs is a member of the Stockbridge-Munsee Mohican Nation, an American Indian tribe located in central Wisconsin. He serves as parish associate at Church of All Nations Presbyterian Church and is the Director of Racial Justice

for the Minnesota Council of Churches. He is founder/convener of "Healing Minnesota Stories," an initiative dedicated to creating events of dialogue, education, and healing, particularly within faith communities. Jim Bear will tell inspiring stories that help create understanding and healing between Native American and non-Native people.



FEBRUARY 7: Empowering People Experiencing Homelessness with Edith Perlin

Edith Perlin is the Director of Edith's House, a five bedroom home in North Minneapolis that not only houses people experiencing homelessness. Edith's House was one of our Dough winners in 2022. Once

this basic need is addressed, a comprehensive plan to address employment, connection to required social services, and emotional support for continued success is created in order to set a clear path to self-reliance. Edith will share stories of people who have walked all the way through their five step empowerment plan, and are currently investing back into their communities.



Next Chapter provides resources and support for those facing the challenges of moving to the Next Chapter in their lives, to help achieve a successful transition.



GUEST SPEAKER: MARIANN JOHNSON Aging with Resilience,

Mindfully Thursday, January 11 6:30-7:30 p.m.

This presentation will focus on mindfulness as an evidence-based

tool for increasing our innate capacity to be mindful, allowing us to be with life's inevitable challenges more resourcefully. Research has demonstrated that practicing mindfulness can help to broaden perspective and down-regulate the stress response, and as we age, support, and strengthen our everyday resilience. Participants will be provided with everyday tips and practices for enhancing their mindfulness and resilience and be guided through a short experiential mindfulness exercise.

Mariann Johnson is a wellbeing and mindfulness instructor for the University of Minnesota's Earl E. Bakken Center for Spirituality & Healing. She has studied and practiced mindfulness meditation for over 25 years and is a certified Mindfulness-Based Stress Reduction instructor through Brown University's Mindfulness Center. Before dedicating her professional life to teaching mindfulness, Mariann served as an organization development consultant and mediator, working with leaders of Fortune 500 companies, government agencies and nonprofit organizations. Her writings on mindful leadership have appeared in the Huffington Post and Mindful Magazine.

Music undeniably holds a powerful psychological influence, as evidenced by research revealing its impact on various brain regions. Engaging in activities such as writing, performing, and listening to music can yield significant benefits. Presenters each have their own personal experience about how music helped their journey in processing, managing, and rediscovering meaning and

joy in life. Personal stories will be shared by Rick Graft, host of Music Heals symposium, and singer/songwriters Annie Fitzgerald, Adam Levy, Katy Vernon, and Katy Tessman. The evening will conclude with singing "Leave a Little Love" by Matthew French, with Doyle Turner and Ted Hajnasiewicz. Our hope is that these shared experiences will strike a chord with others, providing valuable insights that can be applied to personal development and shared with loved ones.





Hello! Happy New Year everyone! It's hard to believe that we are already walking into a new year. Sometimes we move so fast from one thing to the next we never take the time to reflect on the things we are grateful for in the year we have just stepped out of. Here is an idea I read about and I just love it!

At the end of the year, our family gathers in the living room to recall blessings from the previous 12 months. We turn on exactly 12 lights around the house, and we place 12 unlit tea lights across the mantel. Then we reflect on each month (use the calendar from the year to spark ideas): January, something new we tried; February, a special valentine we gave or received; March, our favorite thing about spring; and so on.
